
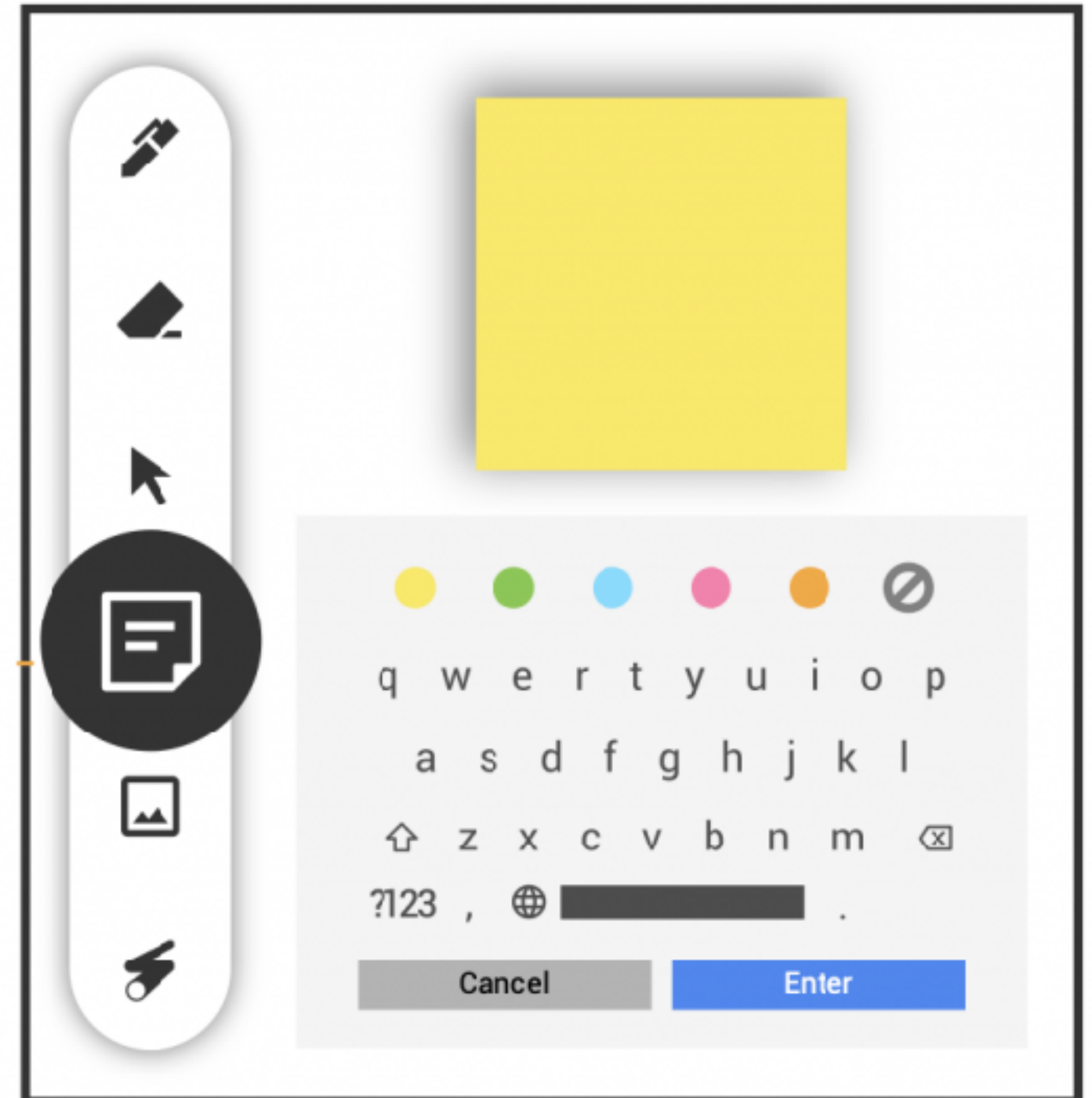


How to use Jamboard



- 1 Go to the toolbar on the left.

What aspects of Healthy Yolo Together outreach were successful in your community?

Consistent messaging.

Mobile vax, going into the migrant farmworker camps to administer, vaxxing the unhoused in Davis.

Gift cards for testing

social media through trusted messengers

Posting data on publicly accessible websites (wastewater monitoring data, testing positivity, etc.)

Jenny's facebook lives. The communication was consistent and concise.

Meeting communities where they are

Communication & consistent framing of mitigation behaviors

offering remote testing in hard to reach populations.

Universal free PCR testing. "Aggie" Public Health Ambassadors that were IN the community doing health education.

Working collaboratively across jurisdictions/silos.

Talking to each other - across agencies.

Outdoor vaccination clinics where people were

feeling that we're all in this together

easy, accessible, free testing

yolo pulling educators to essential worker status was the impetus for getting schools open in short order

Unhoused and congregate care: go to where they are and live

Give volunteers to do something useful

Communication provided by the County PIO

Engagement of business community to help get word out

HYT was a trusted messenger in the community.

Focus on extra supports for those in need - i.e. food delivery when isolating; rent support.

Farmworkers: go to where they are, bring food trucks

Hard to reach: meeting people where they are.

Going to the Hard to Reach communities. Using trusted messengers.

The health messages included accurate science-backed public health recommendations on masking and vaccines.

Make it easy to volunteer

Multiple sites, and central locations in rural communities. (Firehouse)

Go beyond the web; use phones and button features

Partner with CommuniCare

Use data

Paying farm workers to attend vaccine clinics.

Right device for communication with different populations

the satellite daily testing on school campuses was a game changer for getting families to comfortable enough to send kids to school

Creating a subcommittee/subgroup to help target certain communities



Having survived the pandemic, what should be done to complete the healing?

Look at whether staff are being paid appropriately

Time, patience, continued flexibility.

Touch basis with those that you reached out to. Don't just 'drop' relationships or contacts

Disseminating all of the successes so that the general community knows how well they worked together. Promotes pride and the "can do" attitude.

community facilitation of our youth experiences. Normal pressures are back in place, but our kids are not normal.

Training staff in mental health first aid for themselves and for their families

Providing mental, physical, and emotional health support as part of "the work day"

We have and are going through trauma. Take a trauma-informed approach.

Provide therapy...in a world where therapists have limited availability.

Help families support their children that have fallen behind academically

continue to build and maintain partnerships

Continue to support programs that alleviate food insecurity

focus on health equity

Stronger supports for children and youth (tutoring, mental health supports, re-engaging socially with others)

Workplaces should be considering "work life balance" and how they support it

Reflecting back on the time we lost with loved ones and making time now to get some of that back.

Be flexible with work schedules and locations

After the division of beliefs find ways to unite community

Make space for people to share feelings, experiences, trauma, etc.

Acknowledge that people are hurting in their lives outside of work - ask how we might help to connect to services - just as we do with clients we serve

Are there organizations that would lead community restoration circles?

Continue looking at the loss of small businesses and job gaps. (financial)



Does Yolo County need an ombudsman to help direct the community to the right person when they have an issue?

What emerging topics could these tools be applied to?

New efforts to curb infectious disease threats like influenza and RSV. These need similar attention.
